Three Criteria

- ♦ The object
- ♦ The intention
- ♦ The circumstances



The Object

 We refer to the good outcome of our action and to the person



The intention

 We refer to inner movement of the will and the goal of the activity



The Circumstances

 The real situation in which our actions occur



The balance

All three must be in balance

 The voice of our inner being that calls us to love and to always do what is good, right and just. The voice of God.



Forming Conscience

 As Catholics you are called to form your conscience. This takes time, years, and lots of experience.



Prudence

♦ Right Reason in action

Prudence must precede every action that we undertake; for if prudence be wanting, there is nothing, however good it may seem, which is not turned into evil.

Discernment

- A decision-making process that attends to the implications and consequences of an action or choice.
- For good decisions on big and important issues, discernment is needed.
