Baptism to Confirmation





What is Baptism?


What is Baptism?

■ The word Baptism comes from the Greek which literally means "to plunge or immerse."



What is Baptism?

- The early church called it:
 - The water of rebirth
 - The washing of rebirth.
 - enlightenment



What is the history of Baptism?

- Baptism was limited to adults until the Edict of Tolerance (313)
- All three initiation sacraments were conferred at once at the Easter Vigil.
- When Christianity became legal, infant baptism became the norm.

What about a Post Vatican II church?

- Infant baptism changed character from a cleansing of original sin to an initiation ritual.
- Adults and children (anyone over seven), go through an initiation process lasting a year or more to prepare to be baptized at the Easter Vigil.
- At Easter Vigil all three sacrament are conferred upon the Catechumens.

What is Infant Baptism?



Children under seven are welcomed into the church through baptism.

- Before the baptism, parents (and godparents) go through an evening of formation.
- Just before the baptism, parents (and godparents) go to a "how to" session, and paperwork is assembled.

- The presider asks what the parents are seeking
- The child is anointed with the sign of the cross and welcomed
- All listen to the word of God and a short homily.

- All present are asked to reject evil and proclaim faith in God and in the church
- The presider blesses the water
- Family units are called to the font for the baptism

- At the font the child is held over the font and the words
 - "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

As the priest or deacon pours the water over the head of the child.

The action of pouring water or immersing an is entry into the new life of Christ which is the same as entry into the church.

- The child is given a white garment and the light of Christ.
- All say the "Our Father"
- Dismissal

What is Adult Baptism or RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)?

Anyone over seven who is seeking baptism goes through a process much like the early church required. At the end of the year long process they receive all the initiation sacraments at Easter Vigil.

- Four Steps
 - Pre Catechumenate
 - Catechumenate
 - Purification & Enlightenment
 - Easter Vigil
 - Mystagoigia


- Four Steps
 - Pre Catechumenate (*flirting*)
 - Catechumenate (*dating*)
 - Purification & Enlightenment (engagement)
 - Easter Vigil (*weddin*g)
 - Mystagoigia (*honeymoon*)

- The RCIA sessions are weekly
- Those preparing are asked to attend Mass and dismissal each week.
- The Catechumens and Candidates have a companion from the parish, their sponsor.


- At Easter Vigil
 - We gather at the fire and bring the light of Christ into the church.



We listen to our story told, (five to nine readings)



We listen to the homily.

Unpacking the Symbols

- Water: cleansing, and death to old ways
- Oil: soothing, and making easy for movement, strength
- White garment: symbolically putting on Christ!
- Candle: Light of Christ

Results of Baptism

- We become God's adopted sons and daughters.
- The grace of the sacrament empowers to live as Jesus wanted us to live.
- We become the "Body of Christ"
- We become priest, prophet and king

Results of Baptism

Baptism connects us to Christ and seals us with an indelible mark which identifies us as "Christian."

Requirements

- Parents willing to aid the child in his/her religious education.
- Sponsor who are happy, confirmed Catholics in good standing in the church.
- For those in RCIA, a discernment process with the team and their sponsor.

What is the history of Confirmation?

Once infant baptism became the norm, children were baptized soon after birth by a deacon or priest. As soon at the Bishop came to that area, he would confirm or seal the baptism.

What is the Preparation?

- Two Year Process
- Freshmen and Sophomores
- Gather for catechetical sessions, service projects, retreats, and regular worship.



The bishop comes

once a year.

During the Easter Season.



After the homily, the Bishop Lays hands on the candidates.

All-powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit you freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life. Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their Helper and Guide. Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Rite of Confirmation, No 25

What's Changed?

- Confirming or sealing baptism is emphasized
- The slap was replaced with an embrace.
- Any gender sponsor
- Keep baptismal name

Unpacking the Symbols

Chrism (perfumed oil): soothing, and making easy for movement, healing, given to royalty.

Results of Confirmation

Confirmation roots us more deeply in love, unites us more closely to Christ, increases in us the gifts of the Spirit, and binds us more tightly to the church.

Requirements

- At least a freshman in High School to begin process.
- Participation in a two year process.
- Sponsor who are happy, confirmed Catholics in good standing in the church.
