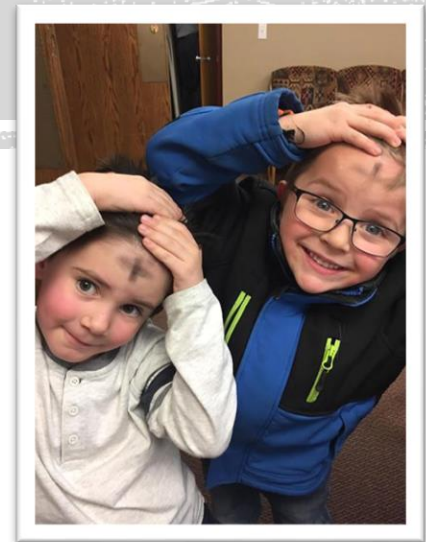

LENT IS A 40 JOURNEY. THE CATECHISM OF THE CHURCH TEACHES US:

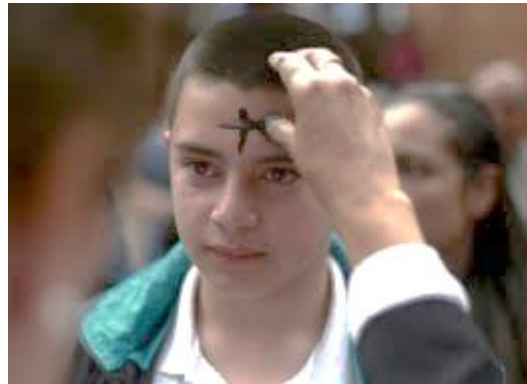
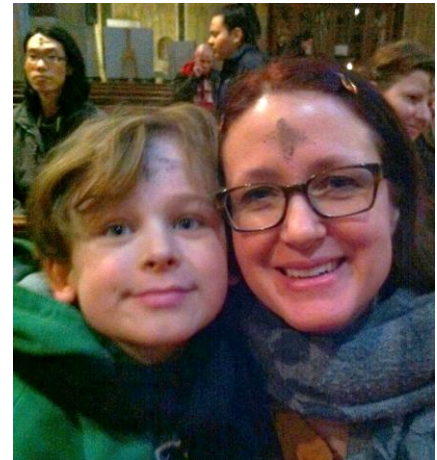
“BY THE SOLEMN FORTY DAYS OF LENT THE CHURCH UNITES HERSELF EACH YEAR TO THE MYSTERY OF JESUS IN THE DESERT” (CCC 540).



**THIS MEANS THAT JESUS INVITES US INTO HIS
LIFE AND SHOWS US THE WAY –
HE CALLS US TO FAST (GIVE UP SOMETHING)
HE CALLS US TO GIVE ALMS (SHARE WITH THE POOR)
AND HE CALLS US TO PRAY.**



WE PLACE THE ASHES ON OUR FOREHEAD
IN A CROSS SHAPE TO REMIND US THAT
JESUS DIED FOR US ON A CROSS.



WE USE PURPLE AT SPECIAL TIMES IN THE CHURCH YEAR. LENT IS ONE OF THOSE SPECIAL TIMES STARTING TODAY OUR CHURCH AND OUR PRIEST WILL BE DRESSED IN PURPLE. YOUR PACKET HAD A PURPLE CLOTH SO YOU CAN DRESS YOUR HOME IN PURPLE TOO!



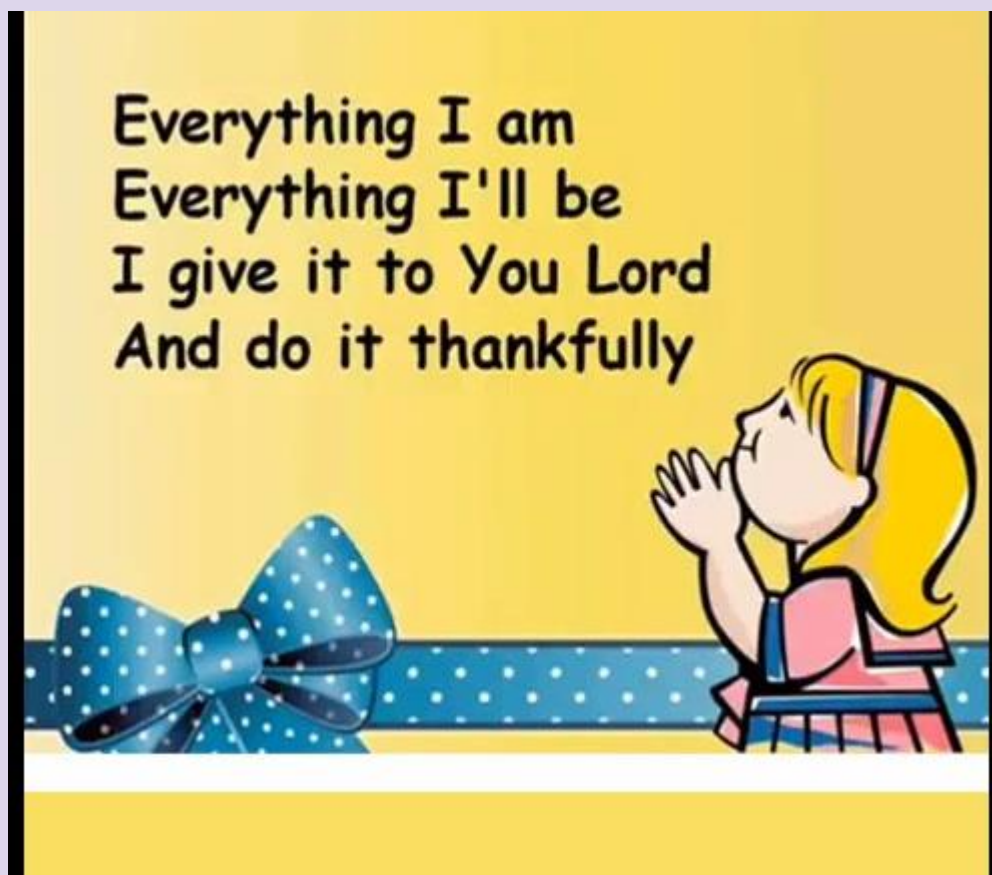
MOST IMPORTANTLY DURING LENT WE MUST

A reading from the book of the prophet Joel

GOSPEL

A reading from the Gospel of Matthew (6:1-6, 16-20)

Jesus said to his disciples:

“Take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them; otherwise, you will have no recompense from your heavenly Father.

When you give alms, do not blow a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets to win the praise of others. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward.

But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing, so that your almsgiving may be secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

“When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward.

But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

“When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. They neglect their appearance, so that they may appear to others to be fasting. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward.

But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you.”

Prayer Leader: My friends, the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ



Today we opened our prayer with the Sign of the Cross on our forehead and now the marking of the ashes recalls our baptism and reminds us that in both life and life beyond life we belong to God; we are “marked as Christ’s own forever.”



THANKSGIVING OVER THE ASHES

Now we will ask God to bless our ashes. Lord our God, we ask you to bless these ashes, symbol of our desire to turn away from sin, and to follow Jesus your Son. May the Holy Spirit give us the strength to pray, do good works and make sacrifices during this holy season of Lent, as we joyfully wait to meet Jesus, risen from the dead, at Easter. We make this prayer to you in the name of Jesus, our Lord.

Family Leader dips a thumb in the ashes and make a cross on the forehead of each person.
