## Catechizing Corner!

Jesus gave Peter a new name. The conferral of a new name in the scriptures signified a transition to something new: a new direction or a new ministry. Simon, now called Peter, which means the rock, would be designated to lead the people. This was to be the new direction for his life.

Like Isaiah and Paul, Peter attested to his own unworthiness and need for repentance. The presence of God, the *shekina* glory, can do nothing less than move a person to deep, interior repentance. The response to such glory is hearing and responding to the call. Peter's declaration of unworthiness foreshadowed his denial of Jesus after his arrest. In the midst of Jesus' inevitable suffering and passion, Peter would deny him. Peter's recognition of Jesus as Lord foreshadowed his first post resurrection encounter with Jesus, when he said, "Lord, you know I love you."

Jesus initiated the call in the face of human limitations. An overabundance of fish was caught only in response to Jesus' initiative. The point? Success in ministry is rooted in Christ. We need only look ahead to the Acts of the Apostles to note the fruits of Peter's sending. Following his empowerment by the Spirit, Peter's first attempt netted three thousand converts."

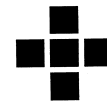

## The Word of God Luke 5:1-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel According to Luke

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret.

He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had **disembarked** and were washing their nets.

Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore.

Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon,

"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."

Simon said in reply,

"Master, we have worked hard all night

and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."

For **astonishment** at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.
