Catechizing Corner!

In today's liturgy Jesus shared a eucharistic meal with his disciples on the road. There is evidence in ancient drawing and artwork that fish may have been part of an early eucharistic meal. Jesus multiplied and distributed the fish and the loaves in his earthly life; now he shares another post resurrection eucharistic meal of fish with his disciples for second time. It is significant that Jesus asked them to feed him. Perhaps it was a symbolic way to remind the disciples that the ball was now in their court. They were to do what Jesus did. They were to go out and feed others.

In connection with the meal, Jesus taught them the scriptures. He reminds them that what they have experienced is part of the fulfillment of salvation history as foretold in the scriptures.

The Word of GodLuke 24:35-48

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke:

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts?

Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

Gospel Glossary

Recounted means to give an account of an event or experience. **Psalms** are scared poems or songs of praise. **Jerusalem** is a city in Israel.

And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled."Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.
