## Catechizing Corner!

On the Sunday that began Holy Week, the Jerusalem Christians of the fourth century proceeded to the great church (Anastasis) called the martyrium (the place behind Golgotha where the Lord was crucified). Following their morning eucharist and right before the dismissal, the archdeacon announced the beginning of the "Great Week" and summoned Christians to meet each day, "beginning tomorrow" at the ninth hour in the martyrium. He instructed them to be ready at the seventh hour (early evening) and to meet at the church on the Mount of Olives. They met at the assigned place and together with the bishop they sang songs, antiphons, and hymns of praise and listened to lessons. At the ninth hour they moved to the place where Jesus ascended into heaven. At the eleventh hour they read the passage of the Lord's triumphant procession into Jerusalem; the bishop then led the procession from the Mount of Olives back to the martyrium in the city. Parents carried their small children and all waved their palm branches as they made their holy trek to the city gates. They processed through the city streets until they arrived at the Anastasis at a very late hour. They prayed the lucernare together, "with prayer at the cross; after which the people were sent home."

# A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

'Wait, let us see if Elijah comes to save him." But Jesus cried out again in a loud voice, and gave up his spirit.
