Catechizing Corner!

Jesus is the model Good Shepherd. He cares for his sheep; they know his voice and respond to his voice. There is ownership. Contrast that with the Pharisees who are merely hired workers who come in to sheer the sheep and care nothing for their welfare. Jesus knows his sheep. He is in loving relationship with them, which is why he is willing to lay down his life for them. In the last analysis, both identifications of Jesus gate and shepherd make the same point. The risen Christ is the One who nourishes his people in his word and sacraments, giving them life and enabling them to have it abundantly.

Through baptism we are incorporated into Christ Jesus. Jesus knows each of us by name and invites us in through the gate. He loves us so intimately that he is willing to lay down his life to keep us from becoming prey to wolves and marauders.

Jesus also offers a model of authentic Christian leadership. Rather than indulging in self-serving interests, we are to take the time to learn the names of our sheep and to become the guardian of the gate that keeps them safe from the dangers of the night.

Begin by calling upon God: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

Let us pause for a moment and listen attentively to this week's passage.

The Word of God John 10:1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said:

"Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a *sheepfold* through the gate

but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber.

But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.

The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice,

as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.

When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him,

because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers."

Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep.

All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them.

I am the gate.

Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find *pasture*. A thief comes only to steal and *slaughter* and destroy;

I came so that they might have life and have it more *abundantly*."

Gospel Glossary

Gospel Glossary

A *sheepfold* is a pen or fence-in area for animals

Pasture is a grassy area for animals to graze.

To slaughter means to kill animals for meat.

Abundantly means with plenty to spare.
