Catechizing Corner!

The cross was a stumbling block for many earlier believers. If Jesus was really the Messiah, how could the Lord God have forsaken him? According to Bible Scholars, the transfiguration shows unequivocally that God no more abandoned lesus than he did his predecessor, Moses. Jesus trusted his Father against all odds. When the world thought of him as dwelling in shame and disgrace, lesus trusted his Father. Believers are to do no less. We are to trust God; we are to be subject to the Lordship of Christ, the new Moses and Lawgiver.

In the doctrine of later generations, the transfiguration was understandably interpreted as the revelation of Christ's divinity. However, the first communities were not so developed in their theology. Matthew's community understood the transfiguration as a proclamation of Jesus as Messiah

The transfiguration is a preview of Christ's resurrected glory and rule from the heavenly throne. On the holy mountain of authority he will rule heaven and earth. It foreshadows the resurrection. Moses and Elijah are integral to the scene. Moses foretold a prophet that would one day reveal God's will to the world. Elijah was understood as a precursor to the day of the final eschaton. Both characters signal the world that the last age has finally arrived.

There is a paradox of the moment. lesus, on this mountain, is surrounded by hero-saints of old. On the hill of Golgotha he will be surrounded by criminals. On this holy mountain Jesus' clothes shine brilliantly. On the hill of Golgotha they are torn from his body in disgrace. The Divine Voice heralds Jesus as Son. His executioners do the same at his murder.

The vision of transcendent glory was to be balanced with the specter of future suffering. There can be no resurrection, no power from on high, to rule supreme over the earth in resurrected glory without the cross. "His suffering was part and parcel of his glory."

# **Gospel Glossary**

**Transfiguration** is when Jesus, looked heavenly and seemed to glow like the sun.

Moses and Elijah are two Old Testament heroes. Moses was the leader who led the Jewish people out of Egypt, and Elijah, a famous prophet.

**Tent,** in this case, probably meant a stand that sells souvenirs. prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."
