Catechizing Corner!

Traditionally miraculous birth events in scripture point to God's role in salvation history. Whenever there are miraculous events surrounding the birth of an individual, it is meant to highlight the role the child would one day assume in God's plan. "Just as God had miraculously created Moses to be his people's deliverer, so now God raised up Jesus to be the new and greater Moses, the ultimate savior." The miraculous circumstances of Jesus' birth would immediately alert peoples in antiquity that this child was destined for a great role in God's plan.

By naming Jesus "Emmanuel-God is with us," Matthew reminds us of the greatest truth of the Incarnation. God through Christ is present in our lives. God through Christ continues to reveal God's self to us. In perfect freedom God, through Christ, invites us into an intimate relationship. When humanity sins, it does not just turn against God's will, but turns its face on the God who dwells within; who desires intimate, living relationship; who spends a lifetime communicating Godself to each individual and to the world. Karl Rahner puts it best: "It is both terrible and comforting to dwell in the incomprehensible nearness of God, and so to be loved by God himself that the first and last gift is infinity and incomprehensibility itself. But we have no choice. God is with us."

Joseph's first response to the mysterious conception was to remove himself from it-to walk away. But God revealed to him that he had a role to fill. He was part of the plan. His first reaction no doubt was shock. "From astonishment to faith and submission of one's life by the reception of the word, extraordinary as it may be--this is the path for all believers and the Church itself to follow to respond to the call of God and his word..

The Word of God Matthew 1:18-24

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about.

When his mother Mary was *betrothed* to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit.

Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame,

decided to divorce her quietly.

Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said,

"Joseph, son of David,

do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home.

For it is through the Holy Spirit

that this child *bas been conceived* in her.

She will *bear* a son and you are to name him Jesus,

because he will save his people from their sins."

Betrothed means engaged.

To Divorce, in this case, means to break off

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: *Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,* which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.
