# **Catechizing Corner!**

Finally, there is the commission, the call and mission of the individual in question. When Elizabeth said, "... blessed is the fruit of your womb. Who am I that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" she prophesied about the mission of the child in Mary's womb. This child will bring salvation. He will be the fulfillment of God's plan. Luke wants to make it clear that both John and Jesus have unique roles to play. John will prepare the way. John will be the bridge between the old covenant and the new covenant. John will help prepare hearts for giving birth to the advent of the messiah. Jesus, however, is that messiah. lesus is the One who will fulfill Israel's hopes. Luke insists that his community have no illusions about "who's who" in the eschatological events about to take place.

Mary and Elizabeth, two great women of scripture, listen to God and become the ultimate paradigm of a disciple. In this scripture text, Mary becomes the great gift and model for the church. She listens, she responds, she obeys with fervor and zeal the voice of God and she acts on that word. We, too, on this last Sunday of Advent are exhorted to "go in haste," to go with zeal and fervor to live the call of the gospel and to share the mighty news it contains. Mary models for us the perfect liturgy. She listens, she gives thanks and praise, she responds in faith to the Word of God and then she goes in haste. Our response will be evidenced by how we live the law of love, how we respond to the needy in our world.

#### Gospel Glossary

The **fruit of the womb** is an old way of speaking about a baby that is still growing inside of its mother's womb.

**By the Lord would be fulfilled** means that God keeps his promises.

And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?

For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."
