Catechizing Corner!

When we gather for liturgy we answer that question. We know who Jesus is—He is the Son of God, the one who came into the world to heal our sickness, to restore us to life, to die for our sins, and to take upon himself the burden of all his children. We can do no less than to love Christ with all our entire being and go out and serve his people.

Gospel Glossary

To make clean here means to heal someone of leprosy. **Sternly** means strictly and harshly. The **priest** was the Jewish leader who offered sacrifices. Only the priest could say that someone was clean. **To offer**

offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them." The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.

something for your cleansing was the practice of making a gift or sacrifice of thanksgiving required by the law of Moses. This was a sign of gratitude to God for the miracle of being healed. **Abroad** means wide and far away.

Questions of the Week:

<u>Teen:</u> Can we identify those in society who are considered "unclean?" How do we treat them? Are we willing to be like Jesus to reach out to them?
