Catechizing Corner!

Jesus exhorts the people "against the universal urge of retaliation. Followers of Jesus are to love their enemy. They are to pray for those who oppress and persecute them. Christians are to love (attitude), to bless and pray (speech) and live according to the teaching of Jesus (action). They are to go beyond the norm of what is expected. This principle of going beyond refers to the justice of God expected and initiated at the creation of the world (hesed). God established a realm of perfect order and harmony at the creation of the world (Genesis). God's free, completely undeserved, equally given, gratuitous love was offered to all people. The response to this love was to be expressed in people's attitudes, speech, and action. God's people were to love God completely, totally and without reservation. This love would be evidenced in the way people loved all of creation: men, women, children, resources, and environment. Thus, to be a child of God meant that the unconditional love of God was to be shown to all people inclusively.

Such love was to be demonstrated by *giving, doing good, and lending.* Who was to be the recipient of the giving, good works, and the lending? When Jesus referred to one's neighbor, the Jewish folks assumed it meant a fellow Israelite. "Behind the notion of 'neighbor' lies profound disagreement... the neighbor he is to love is the Israelite." However, Jesus' intention was far more universal. It was directed toward the non-Israelite, the outcast, and the marginalized. When one's love for an enemy is demonstrated by *giving, lending, or doing good* for that enemy, then the lender, the recipient, and the observer pause to take notice. Truly it goes beyond what is a normal expectation.

Gospel Glossary

The **ungrateful** are those who don't recognize or appreciate the good that someone has done for them

If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the **ungrateful** and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."
