


Welcome to the second Session of Holy Family's Bible Study of the Book of Hebrews 1:1-4



Bring your Bible to each session.

1. The opening of Hebrews contrasts the many ways God once spoke with the singular, ultimate way he now speaks—through the Son.

Imagine a bold and unexpected metaphor that captures this shift.

If you were to compare Jesus to something seemingly unlike Him, what would it be, and why? (For example: "Jesus is the sunrise that renders all candles unnecessary.")

2. Hebrews says Christ is "the refulgence of God's glory."

What does it mean for Christ to reflect God's glory in a way no one else can?

How do you see that glory revealed in his life and mission—and perhaps even in your own life?

3. In ancient times, God spoke through prophets; now, through Jesus.

In what ways do you believe God speaks to the world today?

Through Scripture? The Church? People? Events?

What has your experience been of God's voice in the world around you?

4. On a personal level, how do you hear God speaking to you today?

Through silence, nature, community, clergy, teachers, challenges, prayer...?

What helps you recognize God's voice?

5. Jesus "accomplished purification from sins" and now "sits at the right hand of the Majesty on high."

How does this image of Jesus—both crucified and glorified—shape your relationship with Him? *How does it affect your trust, your understanding of His mission, and your desire to follow Him?*
