Catechizing Corner!

The story tells us little of the mysterious Magi or their origin. However, because of Psalm 72, where kings from Tarshish and the Isles come bearing gifts, it is assumed that the Magi are those referred to in the psalm. This puts their place of origin in Persia. The only reason we have assumed there were three is due to the three gifts of frankincense, gold, and myrrh. In later Western tradition they were given the names Balthasar, Melchior and Caspar. They became symbols of the diversity of the church, of God's manifestation to the Gentile world, to all peoples.

Jesus is called the "King of the Jews" in order to name him the messiah. The star is a reference to a messianic prophecy in the Old Testament book of Numbers in which a star was identified with the messiah (Num 24:17). For Matthew, the Magi signify that Christ has always manifested his glory to people from distant lands. There is noticeable irony in the fact that it is the very scribes and Pharisees who supply the Magi with the scriptures that direct them to the place where their search will end.

In ancient times, people were often attracted to astral religions because of the cold predictability of the stars. The star merely served a purpose. The star was the instrument that would lead people to the One who would break the power of any force that would bind people to a predetermined fate. When people are in God's hands, their fate is secure in and through Jesus. Later the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh became symbols of Christ's kingship, his divinity, and his suffering.

Gospel Glossary

scribe is a Jewish scholar, or learned man. **Myrrh** is a very precious fragrance that was used for important occasions.

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance.

He sent them to Bethlehem and said,
"Go and search diligently for the child.
When you have found him, bring me word,
that I too may go and do him homage."
After their audience with the king they set out.
And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising
preceded them,

until it came and stopped over the place where the child was.

They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod,

they departed for their country by another way.
