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Day I

- 1. What motivates you to study Jeremiah and what do you hope to gain from it?
- 2. Why was the period of Jeremiah's prophetic ministry a tumultuous one for Judah?
- Who was Abiathar and what connection might Jeremiah have had to him (1:1-3)? (See 1 Kgs 2:26-27.)

Day 2

- What are the typical features of a biblical call narrative that are also found in God's call of Jeremiah (1:4-10; see commentary, p. 10)? (See Exod 3:1-12; Judg 6:11-24; Isa 6:1-6.)
- What powerful effects will ensue from the words God will give Jeremiah to speak (1:10)? (See Isa 55:10-11.)
- (6) When have you experienced the awesome power that words can have? (See Prov 18:21; Luke 6:45; Jas 3:1-12.)

Day 3

- 7 How do Jeremiah's visions of an almond tree and a boiling kettle suggest danger for Judah and Jerusalem (1:11-15)?
- (8) God instills Jeremiah with confidence before his adversaries (1:18). Describe a time when your faith gave you confidence or assurance in a difficult or threatening situation.
- a) What two images are used to describe the relationship between God and Israel in 2:1-2 and 2:3? (See Isa 62:5; 1 Cor 3:9; Eph 5:31-32.)
 - b) What images arise in your heart and mind when you contemplate your relationship with God?

- When in its history was God's devotion to Israel especially nourishing, with Israel completely dependent upon God (2:2-3)? (See Deut 32:10-12; Hos 2:16.)
- 11. What are the special features of the type of devotion that are implied by the Hebrew word hesed that is translated as "devotion" in 2:2?
- (12) Through Jeremiah, God calls himself a source of living waters that Israel rejected (2:13-18). What does it mean to you to think of God as a source of living waters? (See Ezek 36:24-27; John 4:10-14; 7:37-39.)

- 13. What has Israel done to be charged with prostitution and to be described as a wild donkey in heat (2:20-24)?
- (14.) What entices people away from God today (2:27)? Are these enticements the same as or different from simple idolatry? (See Phil 3:19; Col 3:5.)
- (15) a) How close to your own neighborhood or general area have the innocent been affected by violence (2:34-35)?
 - b) What steps can local communities take to curb violence?
