Catechizing Corner!

John's gospel exhorts us to follow the great commandment of love. Our Easter faith empowers us to experience what the Opening Prayer asks of God: ".. help us to celebrate our joy in the resurrection of the Lord and to express in our lives the love we celebrate." Through the eucharist we actu-alize and make tangible the indwelling Spirit. We are thus empowered to go out and live the law of love, to evangelize and give witness to the saving power of God. "Strengthen us by this Easter sacrament; may we feel its saving power in our lives"

The Lord asks us to be with his brothers and sisters in the world. When we receive the Spirit of God, we too become defenders of the people. We become God's advocate for those who cannot defend themselves in a hostile world. In his surrender, Jesus gave us life. This gift from the Lord should make us respect and welcome our neighbors with their needs, their suffering, and their life projects. All of this makes up the good conduct in Christ to which Peter is calling us (3:16). We cannot, therefore, allow people to set themselves up as masters of the lives of others. The right to life is the primary right of the human person.

The season of Easter is an extended meditation on the paschal mystery. It is the time in which the entire church is to engage in mytagogical reflection. Today's liturgy takes us right into the heart of Easter's purpose.
