Catechizing Corner!

Not only did the appearance stories serve an apologetic function to prove that Jesus died and rose again, they also laid the groundwork for the future mission of the church. Disciples were to go and tell what they had seen-they were to proclaim Christ crucified and risen from the dead. Jesus appeared to the apostles to commission them to carry on his work. "The sending is based on Jesus' own status, showing that as Jesus carried on God's work, the apostles carry on Jesus' work. Jesus, now with God, is present to the world as God is present to the world.

Jesus is understood as the Lord of the universe. The ascension reveals Jesus' status as Lord and Christ. Since he ascended into heaven, he demonstrated control over the created order of the universe. Thus, Jesus is its master.

Jesus' ascension served as prelude to the sending of his Spirit. In the Acts of the Apostles, Jesus was reported to have ascended the mountain (symbol of heaven) where he "poured out his Spirit." The Sprit would be the One who would continue the work of Christ's new covenant.

Jesus, now in heaven, is able to reveal the things of his role as intercessor and high priest. The ascension of Jesus guarantees that Jesus will return again. It is because Jesus ascended to his Father that he became the Son of Man who will accomplish the completion of God's ultimate plan of salvation for the world. Jesus' ascension reminds us that we will one day share his heavenly home. We are on a journey to our ultimate destiny.
