Catechizing Corner!

In today's pericope, Jesus exhorts his disciples that he is about to leave. He is going to prepare a place where they will one day join him. It will be a place of intimate union with God. Jesus encourages his disciples by telling them that they already know the way to this place. Thomas, of course, doubts that he knows the way. Jesus then tells them, in essence, that he—the Jesus they know and love—is the way, the truth, and the life.

The discourses of chapter fourteen are closely related to Jesus' last meal with his disciples. At the end of chapter thirteen, Jesus warns his disciples that he will soon die. He promises them, however, that he will not leave them alone but will return to take them home with him. This is one of the few places in John's gospel where there is reference to the parousia.

Thomas has no idea what Jesus was talking about. He did not understand; like the Jews, Thomas was clueless. He did not sense that Jesus was returning to his Father. It is at this juncture that Jesus speaks one of the most quoted lines in scripture: "I am the way, the truth, and the life." As the way, Jesus is the incarnate reality of "I Am." He is the only way that people in this earthly reality can know and experience the Creator of all. They know God because Jesus is one with God. If they know Jesus, they know God. Jesus is the revelation of God. Within the person of Jesus is the essence of the Father. Only Jesus reveals who God truly is. Jesus is the life because God is the author of all life. Life comes from God and Jesus is the truth of God. To know Jesus is to know God.
